Data Sources

2020 Census


- Conducted every 10 years
- Counts every person living in the 50 states, District of Columbia, and the five U.S. territories
- Short set of questions (e.g. sex, age, race, Hispanic origin, household/family relationship)

American Community Survey

- Conducted every month, every year
- Sent to a sample of addresses (about 3.5 million) in the 50 states, District of Columbia, and Puerto Rico
- Asks about topics not on the 2020 Census (e.g. education, employment, residence, transportation)
- Available for 1-year, 3-year, and 5-year estimates. 5-year estimates provide larger sample size.





Race and Ethnicity

Race refers to the concept of dividing people into groups on the basis of various sets of physical characteristics and the process of ascribing social meaning to those groups.

Ethnicity describes the culture of people in a given geographic region, including their language, heritage, religion and customs

In basic terms, race describes physical traits, and ethnicity refers to cultural identification. Race may also be identified as something you inherit, whereas ethnicity is something you learn.

Race

Categories included in the census questionnaire generally reflect a social definition of race recognized in this country and not an attempt to define race biologically, anthropologically, or genetically

Collected in accordance with guidelines provided by the U.S. Office of Management and Budget (OMB) most recently set in 1997

Based on self-identification

OMB requires five minimum categories:

- White,
- Black or African American,
- American Indian or Alaska Native,
- Asian
- Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander.

Ethnicity


The U.S. Census Bureau asks whether you're of Hispanic, Latino, or Spanish descent. They recognize that individuals who describe themselves as fitting into this category may be of any race

The Hispanic, Latino, or Spanish categories refer to people who identify with any of the ethnic groups originating from:


- Mexico
- Puerto Rico
- Cuba
- Other Spanish cultures (e.g., Salvadoran, Dominican, Spaniard, Colombian, Guatemalan, Ecuadorian, Peruvian, Venezuelan, Honduran, etc.)

If you do not identify with any of these groups, you would select the option "Not of Hispanic, Spanish, or Latino origin."











Place of Birth and Year of Entry


Place of Birth




Place of Birth: Native Born



Place of Birth: Foreign Born




Year of Entry: Foreign Born



Ability to Speak English




Households and Families

Households: Definitions

Household: A household includes all the people who occupy a housing unit (such as a house or apartment) as their usual place of residence.

- Family household: A family includes a householder and one or more people living in the same household who are related to the householder by birth, marriage, or adoption.
- Nonfamily household: A nonfamily household consists of a householder living alone (a one-person household) or where the householder shares the home only with people to whom he/she is not related (e.g., a roommate).

Household Types



Households

Householders living alone:

- 9.8% of population and 25.8% of households
- 28.0% of householders living alone are 65 years and over

Couples in households:

- 55.3% of households include opposite-sex spouse or unmarried partner
- 1.0% of households include same-sex spouse or unmarried partner


Families

- 29.3% of households include own children under 18 years
- 34.6% of households have one or more people 60 years or over
- 3.4% of households include grandparents that live with grandchildren
 - Householder or parent of householder
 - With or without parents of the grandchildren present

Average family size is 3.2 persons




Poverty Rate by Age






Housing: Renter/Ownership Split




Housing: Ownership by Year Moved Into Unit



Housing: Ownership by Age




Housing: Unit Type by Household




Percent Disabled by Age (All Types)




Disability Types: Percentage of Population




Ambulatory Difficulty by Age




Hearing Difficulty by Age




Vision Difficulty by Age




Cognitive Difficulty by Age



Self-Care Difficulty by Age




Independent Living Difficulty by Age




Resident's Work Location




Means of Transportation to Work

Vehicles Available per Household




